## General Information

Witness a spectacular fleet of tall ships racing through the Great Lakes and making their first ever port appearance in Buffalo. Experience a weekend of family fun, filled with live entertainment, historical exhibits, food and beverages, and much more.

## Transportation

We strongly recommend using NFTA Metro Rail and various parking options throughout Buffalo. An interactive map is available for quick reference and ease in traveling to the festival. Ride hailing zone (Uber, Lyft, and Taxis) is a designated lane on Scott St., Between Washington St. and Michigan Ave, by the Buffalo News Building and opposite (716) Food and Sport.

Bike racks are available in various locations just outside the festival grounds.

**Marine Drive and Erie St. will be closed with limited access. Please plan accordingly.**

## How to Navigate the Event

1. Basil Port of Call Buffalo includes the Parade of Sail presented by OneNiagara®, family entertainment, maritime music and all other festival activities and services.
2. Paid Passport tickets are required to board the tall ships. Purchase a Passport ticket at any of the TICKET INFO TENTS located throughout the festival site. A Passport ticket allows you to board as many ships as possible in one day, with one boarding per ship. Soft sole shoes only, no high heels. Due to ship capacity, the ability to board all ships in one day may be limited.
3. Passport tickets are \$20 for adults, \$18 for seniors 65+ and veterans, and \$10 for children 11 years of age and under and can be purchased any day of the festival, July 5, 6 or 7, 2019. A limited number of ADULT VIP PASSPORTS are on sale for \$125 each, and allow for unlimited and expedited tall ships boarding all weekend, preferred parking, entry to the Wegmans Hospitality Deck and complimentary refreshments. HURRY!...AVAILABILITY IS LIMITED\*\*\*
4. If you purchased your Passport ticket on line or at Wegmans, bring your voucher or receipt to any TICKET INFO TENT to receive your Passport book and hand stamp for ship boarding.
5. All sales are final. Sorry, no refunds. **Event will be held rain or shine.**

## Safety & Security

As an Official Host Port of the Tall Ships Challenge®, Basil Port of Call Buffalo observes the US Coast Guard's safety measures as a Marine Event of National Significance. To help assure your safe enjoyment of this event, please observe all security procedures designed to protect you and all our guests.

The following items will not be permitted in the secured areas near the tall ships: No coolers, cans, bottles or beverages, except special food related to a health or medical condition or for feeding a baby. Backpacks and selfie sticks are not allowed. No weapons, alcohol, or illegal substances.

All items are subject to search prior to entrance. Purses, diaper bags and camera bags will be inspected at the entrance gates.

Strollers are not permitted on the ships. They may be placed near the ship gangways.

Non-commercial photography and video is allowed. Commercial and media photographers should contact the Media Tent at Zone A/ Canalside

## Accessibility

Due to their historic nature, the tall ships have limited accessibility to those with physical disabilities. Guests boarding ships must be able to walk up a gangway and be able to handle vertical ship stairs and/ or ladders if present.

The Basil Port of Call Buffalo Steering Committee has extended the festival experience to everyone by offering dockside interpretations for those with limited mobility, vision impairments, or the deaf. From 10:00 – 11:00 am each morning (Friday, Saturday and Sunday, July 5-7), the captains and crew of three of the tall ships will give FREE dockside talks about life aboard a tall ship, and how the ship is rigged and operated. ASL interpreters will be present to sign. The talks will take place on shore on the Erie St. Riverwalk at Zone B near the entrance to Erie Basin (adjacent to Miss Buffalo's dock). Handicapped parking is available just across the street in the 20 Wilkeson Way lot and 1-81 La Riviere lot. See map included in this Event Guide for location details.

Service dogs are permitted, but not pets. Service dogs are not allowed on board the ships.

## Evacuation

In the event of an emergency evacuation the event's security team, in cooperation with local authorities, are responsible for initiating and conducting any necessary evacuations.

## First Aid, Lost Persons or Property

Visit one of the Ticket Information tents for assistance. Lost persons will be reported to Security.

## Frequently Asked Questions

- What if I'm not able to board all the tall ships in one day... can I return to the festival a second (or third) day to tour the other ships? Yes. Bring your POCB Passport to any Info Center at the festival site, and purchase a dated hand stamp for ship boarding on that day.
- What is your refund policy? All sales are final. POCB Passports are not refundable.
- What if I lose my Passport Voucher or my POCB Passport? Sorry, we cannot issue replacements. Protect these valuable documents the way you would protect cash.
- What if it rains? Event will be held rain or shine. Bring your hooded slicker and come see the ships, they won't return for three more years!

Bluenose II is a Canadian national symbol, depicted on stamps and her nation's ten-cent coin. A replica of a legendarily fast Grand Banks fishing schooner, she is the tallest of the Buffalo fleet's tall ships with a mainmast 130 feet high. Owned by the Province of Nova Scotia, the 181-foot two-masted wooden schooner sails from Lunenburg. She last visited Buffalo soon after her launching in 1963; rebuilt in 2012, she sails with a crew of 18.

Denis Sullivan is a traditional Great Lakes topsail schooner of the type once common on the Great Lakes. She flies a triangular square-rigged topsail on her 95-foot foremast, and carries students and the general public on educational day sails and private charters for Discovery World Ltd. of Milwaukee, WI. At 137 feet in length, the three-masted wooden schooner sails with a crew of 10 and offers programs on sailing, history, ecology, marine science and professional development for educators.

At 203 feet, Empire Sandy is the largest vessel in the Buffalo fleet. A three-masted schooner out of Toronto, she is a converted steel deep-sea salvage tug that saw service in the North Atlantic with the British Navy in World War II. Now a tern schooner – the name comes from the relative heights of her masts – she primarily does day sails, private cruises, weddings and corporate events on the Toronto Harbourfront. She is a hospitality ship able to seat more than 160 visitors for below-decks dining, or host 275 passengers on daysails.

HMCS Oriole is the oldest commissioned ship in the Royal Canadian Navy and also the longest serving commissioned ship. Now the sail training vessel of the Royal Canadian Navy, this sailing ketch is based at CFB Halifax in Halifax, Nova Scotia. She was originally built in 1921 as the flagship for the Royal Canadian Yacht Club in Toronto and commissioned into the RCN in 1952. At a length of 108 feet, this vessel has a complement of one officer and five enlisted along with capacity for 18 trainees.






# ZONE B • ERIE STREET DOCK

NAO Santa Maria is a new replica of the Spanish three-masted deep water ship that was the flagship of Christopher Columbus' exploration fleet. Built in the Spanish province of Huelva during the 525th anniversary of the 1492 voyage, she was launched on March 15, 2018 as part of the historic replica fleet of the Nao Victoria Foundation in Seville. A 95-foot nao, a centuries-old vessel type known in Britain as a carrack, she sails with a crew of 20.

US Brig Niagara is a reconstruction of Commodore Oliver Hazard Perry's historic wooden flagship from the Battle of Lake Erie during the War of 1812. She hails from nearby Erie, PA and is a frequent visitor to Buffalo. Now a 198-foot sailing training vessel, the two-masted square-rigger has a rig height of 120 feet and sets 11,600 square of sail. She sails for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania with a crew of 18 and 22 trainees as young as 16, on voyages of experiential learning.



Picton Castle is a beautiful three-masted square-rigger that just completed her seventh circumnavigation of the globe under Capt.



Dan Moreland. The stately 179-foot steel vessel hails from Rarotonga in the Cook Islands, and is licensed to sail on long-distance deep water sail training voyages from an unofficial home port in Lunenburg, Nova Scotia. With masts to 100 feet tall, she spreads 12,450 square feet of sail and voyages with a crew of 12 and 40 sail trainees. She is a converted Welsh fishing trawler that served as a World War II British Navy minesweeper before Capt. Moreland rebuilt her as a sailing vessel.

A wood-hulled Baltimore clipper-style two-masted topsail schooner from the War of 1812 era, she is a 157-foot vessel with sharply-raked masts reaching 1107 feet high, and sails with a crew of 12 and up to 33 guests or trainees for historical education day sails. She was launched in 1988 to replace the first Pride of Baltimore.
